REMOVING TELEPHONE WIRE UPDATE No.8 - 15th October 2020 INSIDE HWANGE NATIONAL PARK






Since the departure in mid-September of the Vic Falls guides and ZPHGA volunteers, the D.A.R.T./Ukhozi Team had been working alone on the time-consuming task of replacing many old, rotten telephone poles in many sections before they could start removing the decommissioned telephone wire.

At the beginning of October however, the team welcomed the arrival of Mr Alec Sibanda, Mr. Crispen Ndlovu, Mr Japhet Ndlovu, three volunteer guides from the town of Dete.

Thanks to this invaluable assistance, the team was able to move much faster and FINALLY RECOVERED ALL the telephone wire from the most challenging and daunting sections where the many fragile poles had slowed the Team's earlier progress.



TELEPHONE WIRE REMOVAL PROGRESS ALONG DETE ROAD



Road (see Report No.7), the "pending" sections have now been CLEARED of phone wire.

In the progress map for the Dete

<u>Section 2</u> (6wires remained/pole) 22poles = 21gaps x 50m=1,050m 6wires x 1,050m=<u>6,300m (6.3km)</u> Weight = 108kg/1000m = <u>680kg</u>

Section 3 (21wires remain/pole) Total Wire = 18,900m (19km) Total Wire Weight = 2,041kg

Section 4 (8wires remained/pole)
Total Wire = 2,000m (2km)
Total Wire Weight = 216kg
TOTAL = 27.3km (2.9 Tons)

INSIDE THE NATIONAL PARK FROM MPOFU ENTRANCE GATE


After the completing the difficult sections along the Dete Road, the Team turned their attention to an equally challenging section INSIDE the National Park from Mpofu Entrance Gate to the "White Road" (see map below)

With thanks to Area Manager Mr. Brighton Joroma, a National Parks Ranger was allocated to protect the team and overnight accommodation was provided at Main Camp while the Team worked inside the National Park.

In this **3.15km section**, a total of 20x old telephone poles had to be replaced.

Thereafter a total of 50.4km of wire weighing approximately 5.2 tons was recovered & removed from the area

INSIDE THE NATIONAL PARK FROM MPOFU ENTRANCE GATE



Having been alerted to the presence of more telephone wire along a 14km stretch that had supposedly been cleared by others some time ago, the D.A.R.T./Ukhozi team went to inspect it. This was quite an adventure!!

While most of the telephone wires had been recovered, we DID find a lot of forgotten wire. Our progress was slowed not only by the many fallen poles we found littering and blocking the road but also at other sections where the acacia & dichrostachys bush regrowth had rendered the road totally impassable. In the end we were forced to drive along the railway line with one set of wheels on the ballast......

To our surprise none of the 5-strand telephone support cables had been cut off the poles or removed.







We didn't bring a ladder because we didn't expect that the support cables had not been removed from the poles.

These 5-strand steel cables are highly prized by poachers to make buffalo & giraffe snares so we couldn't leave them behind and without a ladder, some innovative plans were made to cut & remove these potentially lethal wires













After cutting & collecting all the 5-strand support cables, the Team found & rolledup many untidy "bird's nest bundles" of wire. Along the way many long-forgotten rolls of telephone wire abandoned beside the road were also collected.

Tues 13th Oct was the last day Iganyana Lodge prepared & delivered their much appreciated bush lunches. The Team was then handed the remnants of the donated produce and the Ukhozi Team will once again have to cook for themselves !!

PROJECT UPDATE - The removal of 78km wire by the Ukhozi Team & Dete Volunteer Guides (1-15th Oct) brings total phone wire now recovered to:
